Adult correctional statistics

The Adult Correctional Services Survey data for 2013/2014 are now available. This survey collects information on admissions to and releases from adult correctional services for Correctional Service Canada and the 12 reporting provinces and territories. Survey data include information on the number of admissions and characteristics of the offender, including sex, age group, Aboriginal identity and length of time served.

Data from the Corrections Key Indicator Report for Adults for 2013/2014 are also available. This survey reports on trends in correctional populations and provides a basis for calculating incarceration rates.

Youth correctional statistics

The Youth Custody and Community Services survey data for 2013/2014 are now available. This survey provides information on initial entry, admissions to and releases from youth correctional services for nine reporting provinces and territories. Survey data include information on characteristics of the offender, including sex, age group, Aboriginal identity and length of time served.

Data from the Corrections Key Indicator Report for Youth for 2013/2014 are also available. This survey reports on trends in correctional populations and provides a basis for calculating incarceration rates.
