

General Social Survey, Cycle 30: Canadians at Work and Home: Public Use Microdata Files, 2016

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The public use microdata file for the 2016 General Social Survey (GSS) is now available.

The main objective of the 2016 GSS on Canadians at Work and Home was to collect information on the lifestyle behaviour of Canadians that affects their health and well-being, both in the workplace and at home. The survey covered individuals aged 15 years and older living in private households in the provinces.

The initial results from the 2016 GSS on Canadians at Work and Home were released in *The Daily* on November 14, 2017.
