Farm product prices, December 2018

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in The Daily, Tuesday, February 5, 2019

Prices received by farmers in December for grains, oilseeds, specialty crops, potatoes, cattle, hogs, poultry, eggs and dairy products are now available at the provincial level.

For example, the price of hogs in Quebec was \$65.33 per hundredweight in December, down 9.3% from November and down 8.8% from December 2017 when the price was \$71.62 per hundredweight.

Meanwhile, the price of wheat (excluding durum) in Alberta was \$256.23 per tonne in December, up 1.0% from November and up 0.4% from December 2017 when the price was \$255.10 per tonne.

Note to readers

The price of over 35 commodities is available by province, with some data series going back 40 years. Price data are extracted from administrative files and derived from Statistics Canada surveys.
