

Farm product prices, January 2019

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in *The Daily*, Wednesday, March 6, 2019

Prices received by farmers in January for grains, oilseeds, specialty crops, cattle, hogs, poultry, eggs and dairy products are now available at the provincial level.

For example, the price of corn in Ontario was \$194.59 per tonne in January, up 0.5% from December and up 7.7% from January 2018 when the price was \$180.60 per tonne.

Meanwhile, the price of slaughter cattle in Saskatchewan was \$115.99 per hundredweight in January, up 1.5% from December but down 3.1% from January 2018 when the price was \$119.69 per hundredweight.

Note to readers

The price of over 35 commodities is available by province, with some data series going back 40 years. Price data are extracted from administrative files and derived from Statistics Canada surveys.
