

Computer and peripherals price indexes, April 2019

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in *The Daily*, Friday, May 31, 2019

The price of desktop and similar computers, laptop and tablet computers, and servers declined 0.1% in April.

Desktop and similar computers, tablets and laptops decreased 0.1%, while servers increased 0.6%.

Smartphone prices were flat.

The computer peripherals index edged down 0.1%. Prices for computer printers decreased 0.2%, while prices for computer monitors were unchanged.

Year over year, prices for desktop and similar computers, laptop and tablet computers, and servers decreased 1.3%. Prices for computer peripherals declined 0.6% compared with April 2018.

Note to readers

The computer and peripherals price indexes are a monthly series that measure the changes over time in the price of computers, computer peripherals and smartphones sold to governments, businesses and households. With each release, data for the previous six months may have been revised. The indexes are not seasonally adjusted.
