
Dairy statistics, November 2020

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in The Daily, Monday, January 25, 2021

The total amount of milk sold off farms increased 3.0% year over year to 770 453 kilolitres in November. Meanwhile, milk sold off farms for fluid purposes rose 1.2% to 234 217 kilolitres. Milk sold off farms for industrial purposes grew 3.7% year over year to 536 235 kilolitres.

Total cash receipts from milk and cream sold off farms amounted to \$605.1 million in November, up 2.1% year over year.

Note to readers

Dairy statistics are available for Canada and the provinces.

Milk sold off farms, total, is the total milk sold from Canadian farms; it includes milk for fluid purposes and milk for industrial purposes.

Milk sold for fluid purposes is milk used for table milk and cream (excluding sour cream).

Milk sold for industrial purposes is milk used for manufactured products such as butter, cheese, yogurt and ice cream.

Data in table 32-10-0001-01 on dairy stocks are as of December 1, 2020, and represent the ending stocks of the previous month.
