

Monthly Survey of Manufacturing: Flash estimate, March 2022

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in *The Daily*, Tuesday, April 26, 2022

Given the rapidly evolving economic situation, Statistics Canada is providing an advance estimate of sales in the manufacturing sector for March. Advance results indicate that total manufacturing sales rose 1.7% in March. The growth was mainly due to higher sales in the petroleum and coal, primary metal, and paper product industries.

This estimate was calculated based on a weighted response rate of 77.0%. The average final response rate for the survey over the previous 12 months has been 94.2%. As Statistics Canada continues to collect data for the March reference month, this early indicator is subject to a higher revision rate than our regular monthly release.

Note to readers

The percentage change is calculated using seasonally adjusted data in current dollars.

This flash estimate is a special product published in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic to provide Canadians with timely information on the manufacturing sector. The official estimate of manufacturing sales for the month of March, which will be based on a more complete set of survey and administrative data, is scheduled for release on May 16, 2022.
