

# Value added in exports, 2020

Released at 8:30 a.m. Eastern time in *The Daily*, Thursday, June 2, 2022

National data on the value added in exports for 2020 are now available. The national value added in exports for 2018 and 2019 have been revised.

The provincial data on the value added in exports for 2018 are now available.

## Note to readers

*The value added in exports database provides data on the exports and imports of industries, as well as on the direct and indirect impact of exports on gross domestic product and jobs by industry. Industry impacts can be viewed from the perspective of their impact on other industries or from the perspective of an industry's dependence on other industries. Data cover the period from 2007 to 2020 and rely on the supply and use tables, which provide the basis for the calculations.*

*The estimates for 2019 and 2020 are only available nationally. They are based on advanced estimates of the Canadian supply and use tables that were modelled based on industry indicators of output and gross value added and benchmarked to published income and expenditure account figures.*
