This video demonstrates how Statistics Canada applies data ethics principles by raising potential ethical considerations throughout the data journey. It will also walk you through an example of a potential use case.

As part of our "Statistics 101" series, a new video titled "[Statistics 101: Statistical Bias](#)" is also available today. This video explains the concept of statistical bias, which occurs when there are problems with the way the data were collected, analyzed or modelled, resulting in statistics that differ systematically from the reality they are trying to measure.
