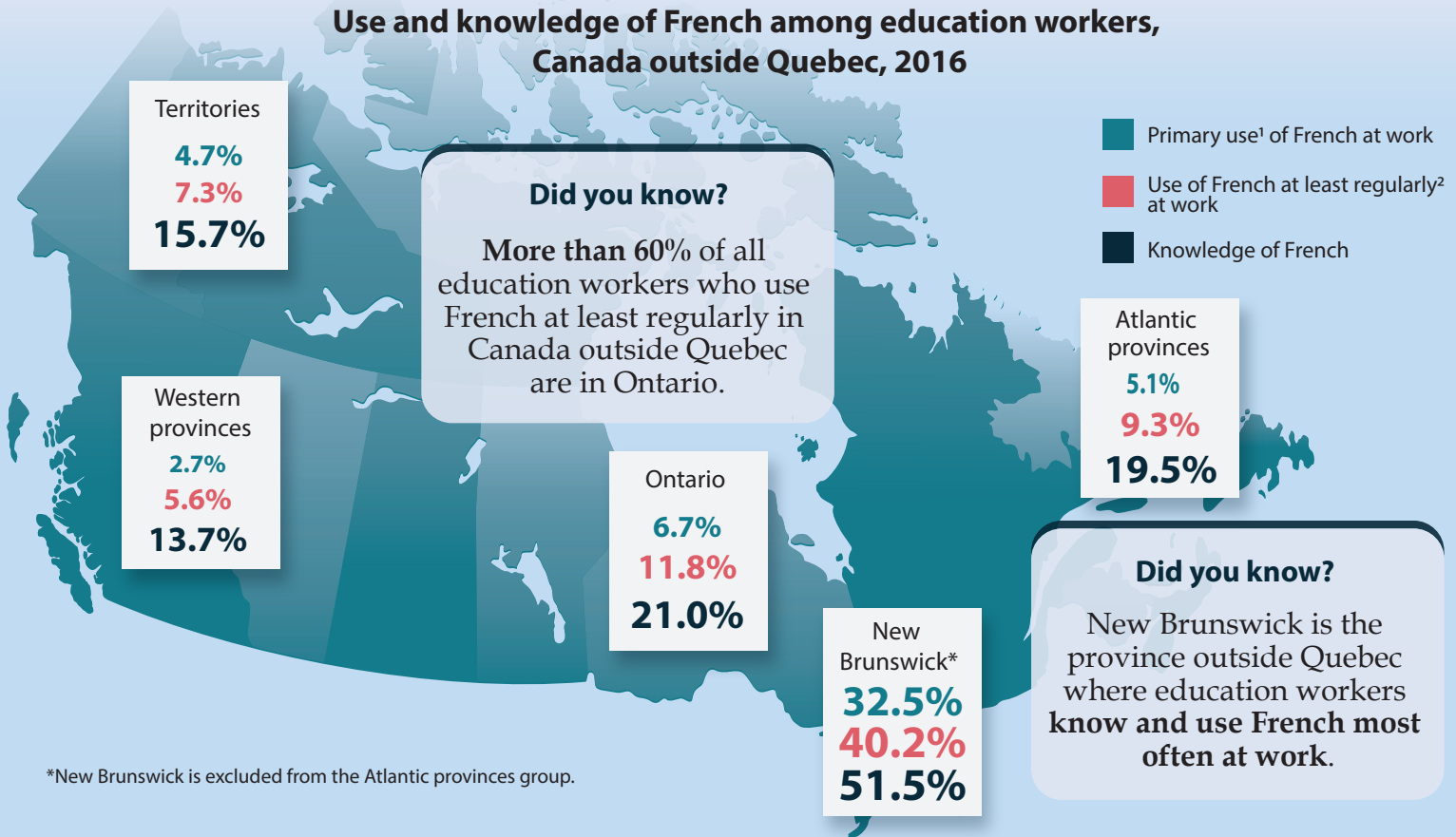


French among education workers in Canada outside Quebec, 2011 to 2016



In 2016, there were **1,040,100** education workers in Canada outside Quebec, with 194,580 who knew French. From 2011 to 2016, the number of education workers who used French at least regularly **increased by 11.9%**.

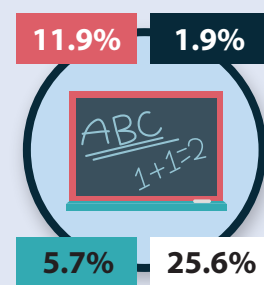
Use and knowledge of French among education workers, Canada outside Quebec, 2016



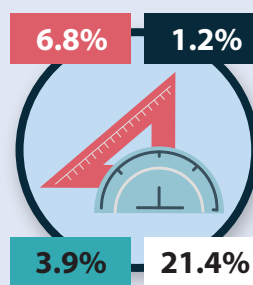
Knowledge of French and its use at work, by occupation, Canada outside Quebec, 2016

- Knowledge of French

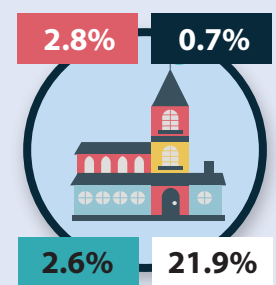
Elementary school and kindergarten teachers



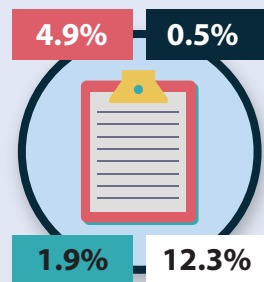
Secondary school teachers



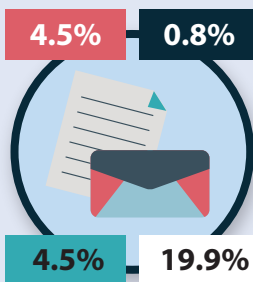
Postsecondary education workers



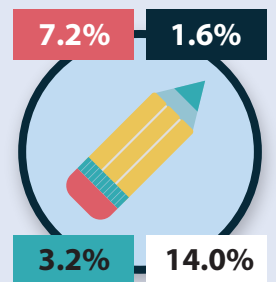
Education support workers

Notes:

- Primary use:** When a worker declares that they use a language most often at work, exclusively or in combination with another secondary language.
 - Use at least regularly:** When a worker declares that they use a language at work either most often or regularly, in combination with another language or not.
- ** Using French at work does not necessarily mean teaching in this language. French could also be used at meetings, for research or because textbooks are in French.
