

CONFIDENCE IN CANADIAN INSTITUTIONS

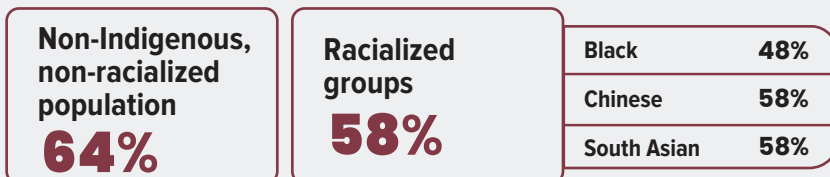
Confidence in police services, schools and the justice system is higher than confidence in other institutions.

Proportion of Canadians who reported having a good or great deal of confidence in these institutions



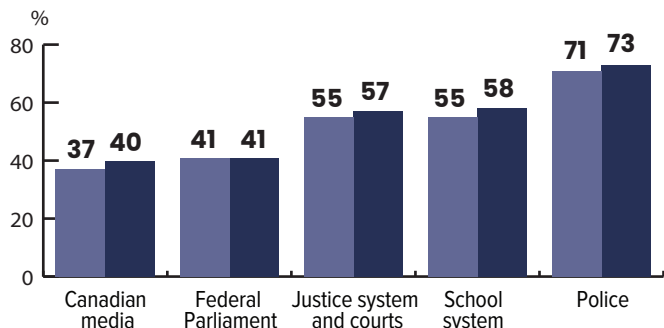
However, racialized Canadians are less likely to have high levels of confidence in the police

Proportion of Canadians who reported having a good or great deal of confidence in the police

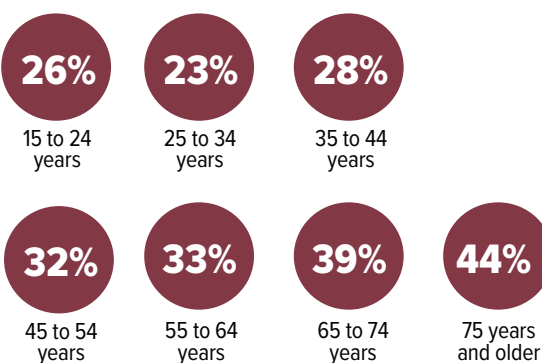


Canadians who reported having high life satisfaction or a hopeful view of the future tend to have higher levels of confidence in institutions

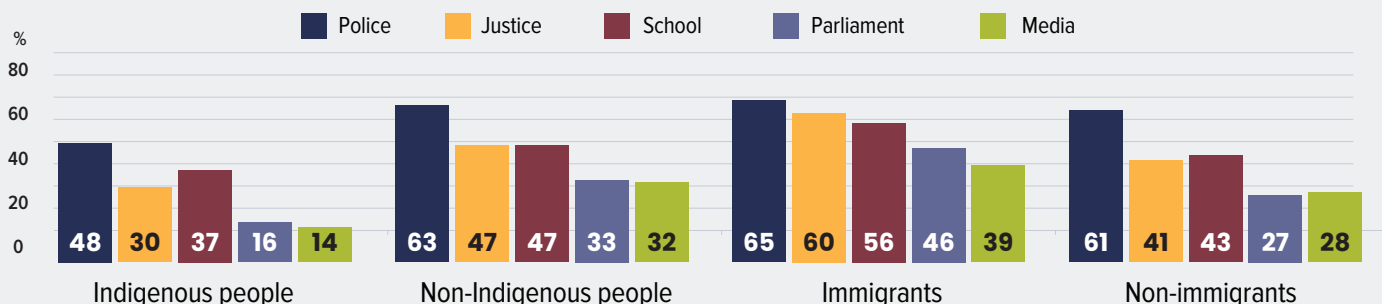
Hopeful view of the future High life satisfaction
