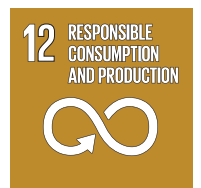

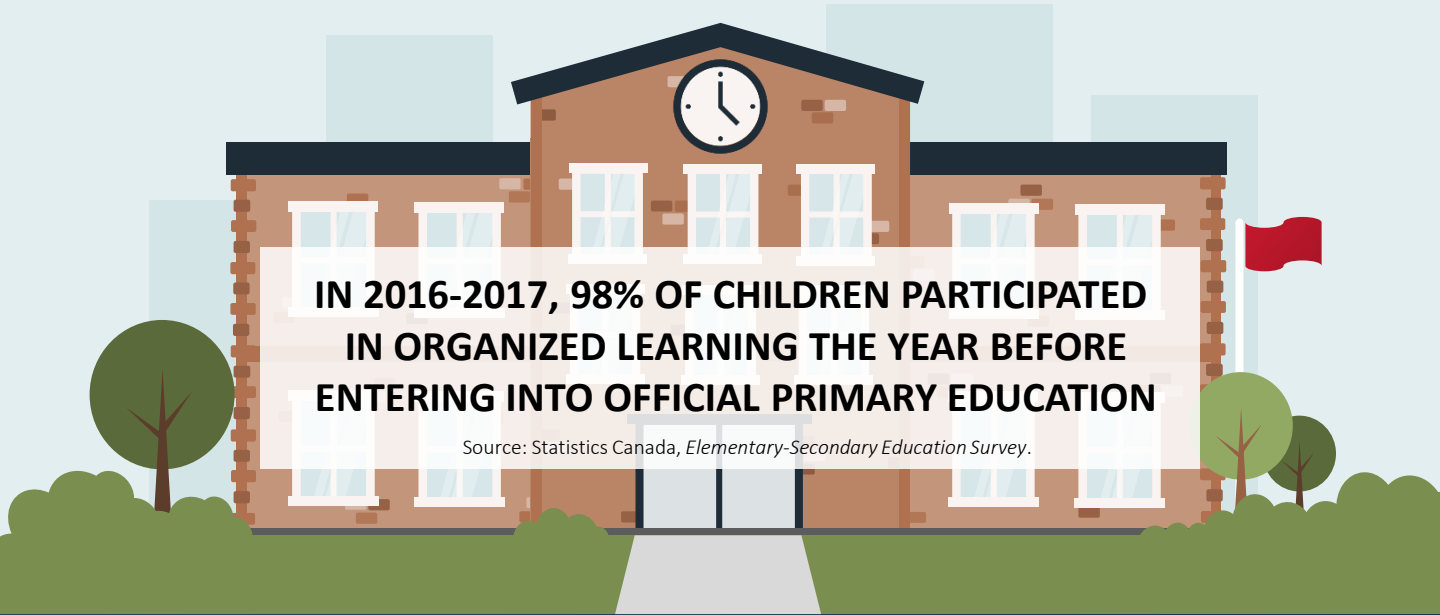

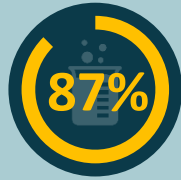

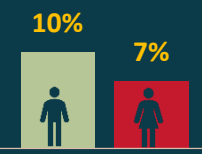
COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

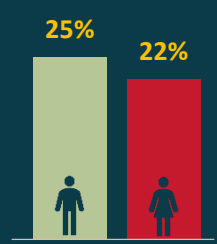
EDUCATION BY HIGHEST LEVEL ATTAINED, 2018



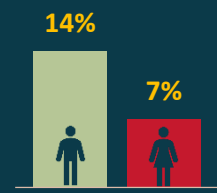

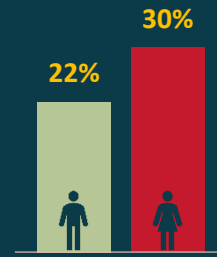

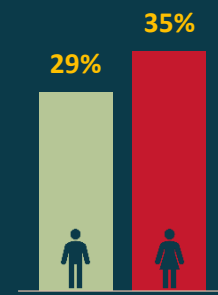
