






























SUSTAINABLE GENALS



ECOTRUST CANADA is a registered charity that works to build the capacity of communities, First Nations and entrepreneurs to participate in an economy where social, cultural and environmental interests are at the center of decision-making. Their focus is on rural regions and Indigenous communities that depend on renewable resources and natural ecosystems for their economic, social, and cultural sustainability. In 2018, they developed a successful pilot project in partnership with Heiltsuk Tribal Council in Bella Bella, BC, where diesel furnaces in 40 on-reserve homes were switched to electric heat pumps powered by nearby hydropower.
