IN 2018, OVER 2 MILLION CRIMINAL CODE INCIDENTS WERE REPORTED BY POLICE, WHILE THE SEVERITY OF CRIME HAD **FALLEN 17%** FROM 2008.



Peacebuilders has diverted over 1,100 young people from across the City of Toronto out of the criminal justice system before trial and having all their charges withdrawn. Peacebuilders schools have seen an 80% reduction in student suspension rates through the use of restorative practices to change the way the education system addresses student misbehaviour and conflict.
