



## Student worksheet 1: Guide for writing the report

1. After scanning the *Canada Year Book* pages referred to in Student worksheet 2, develop three or four major questions to answer or statements to explain in your article. These questions or statements may involve trends, patterns, comparisons or significant changes you have identified. Talk these over with members of your group so that everyone is clear about the focus of your research.
2. Answer your questions or explain your statements.
3. Write your article using appropriate sentence and paragraph structure. Be sure to include the following:
  - a. an engaging introductory paragraph outlining what you intend to report
  - b. three or more paragraphs stating the relevant details and comments from your research
  - c. a concluding paragraph summarizing what you have found
  - d. references for all sources that you quote
  - e. a bibliography of all statistics consulted, but not necessarily used, from the editions of the *Canada Year Book*.
