POLICE-REPORTED FAMILY VIOLENCE

All types of violent crime perpetrated by a family member that was **REPORTED TO THE POLICE**

In 2014, more than 323,600 people were victims of a violent crime, **26%** of whom were victimized by a **FAMILY MEMBER**.




7 in 10 victims of family violence were **WOMEN AND GIRLS**.

YOUTH aged 12 to 17 years were at highest risk of **SEXUAL ASSAULT**, both family and non-family related.



More than **15,200** victims of a violent crime were under 12 years old. These **CHILDREN** were most often harmed by a family member.

More than 9,200 **SENIORS AGED** (65 years and older)
were victims of violent crime,
about 1/3 committed by

SELF-REPORTED SPOUSAL VIOLENCE

Incidents of physical and sexual spousal violence that MAY OR MAY NOT HAVE BEEN REPORTED TO THE POLICE

70% OF SPOUSAL VIOLENCE is not reported

not reported to the police



Many victims of spousal violence experience **SEVERE FORMS OF VIOLENCE**:


25% were sexually assaulted, beaten, choked or threatened with a gun or a knife

24% were kicked, bitten, hit, or hit with something



34% of female spousal violence victims

16% of male spousal violence victims



10% of female spousal violence victims
