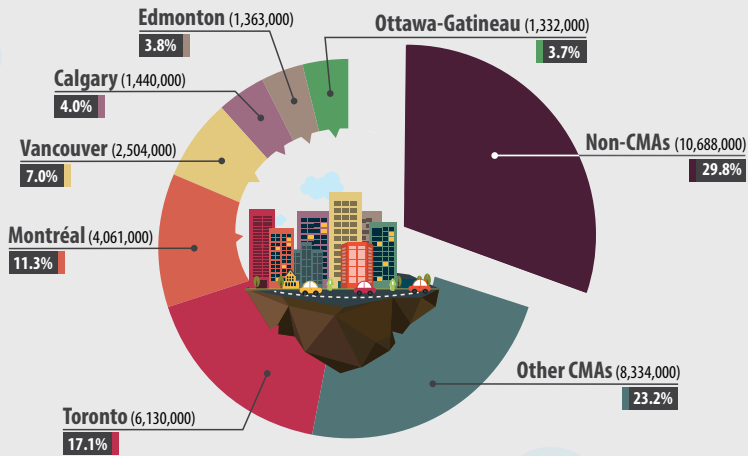


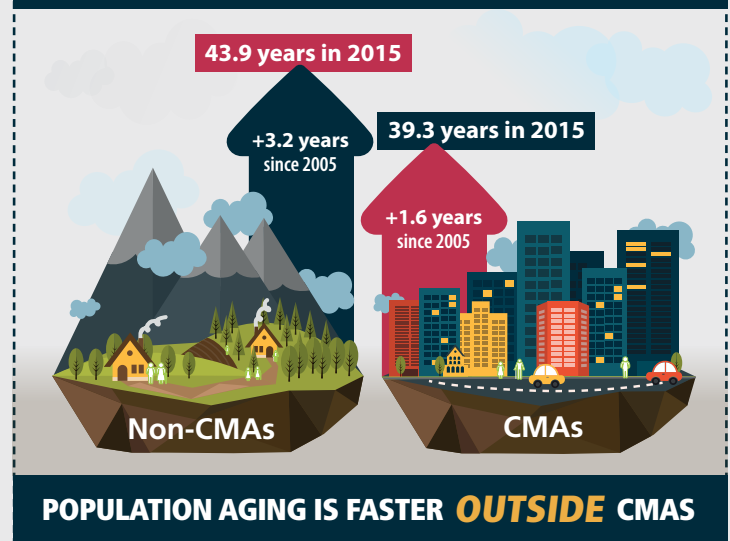

INCREASE OF MEDIAN AGE SINCE 2005

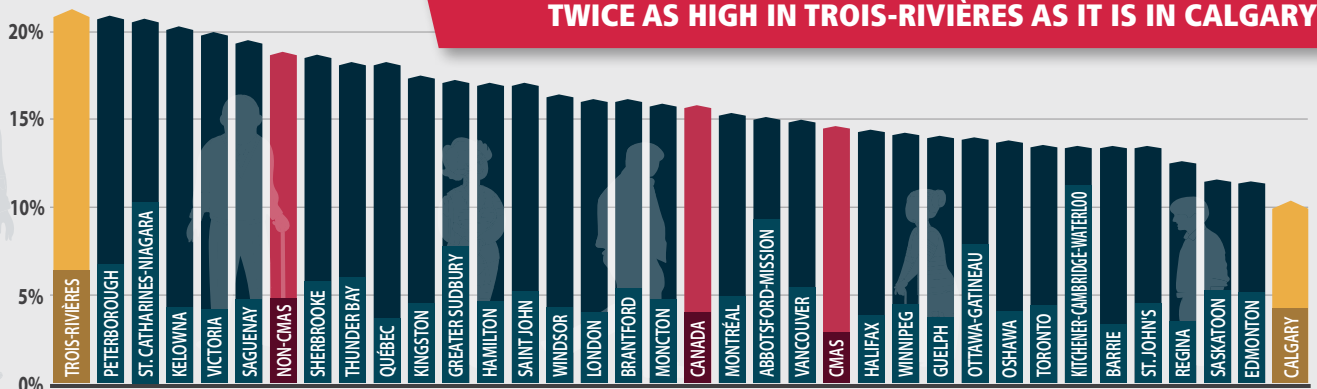


ALBERTA CMAs EXPERIENCED THE STRONGEST POPULATION GROWTH BETWEEN 2005 AND 2015

Census metropolitan area (CMA): Area consisting of one or more neighbouring municipalities situated around a core. A census metropolitan area must have a total population of at least 100,000 of which 50,000 or more live in the core. Canada has 33 CMAs; regions that are not CMAs are categorized as non-CMAs.
