

YOUNG PEOPLE NOT WORKING, IN SCHOOL OR TRAINING WHAT WERE THEY DOING?

In September 2018,

**779,000 CANADIANS
AGED 15 TO 29**

were not in employment, education or training (NEET). This represented 11.3% of people in this age category.


NEET individuals said that a physical or mental health concern or disability had kept them from working, going to school, or doing some other main activity.

About 3 in 10 NEET individuals had volunteered for a group or organization to some extent in the past 12 months.


