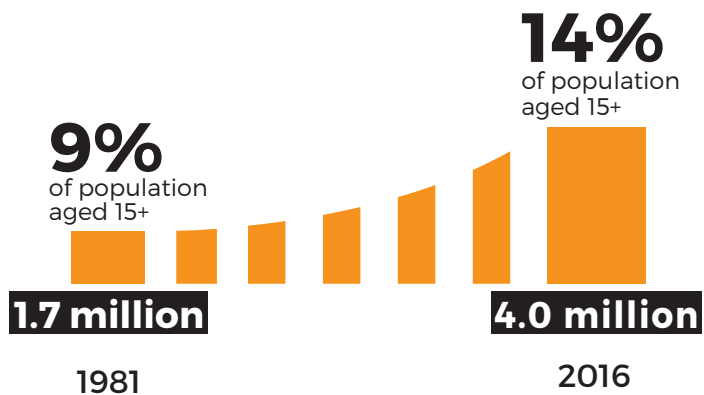


WHO LIVES ALONE?

Nearly 4 million Canadians lived alone in 2016, more than double the number in 1981



Among 20-34-year-olds living alone and not in a couple relationship in 2017:

60% said that they intended to marry or remarry,



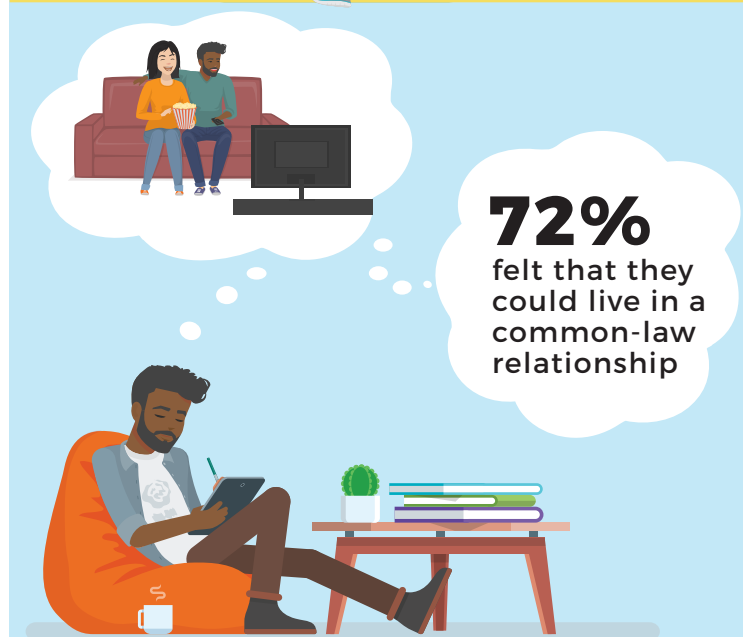
Among those 20 and older who lived alone in 2017:

More than **7 in 10** had previously been in a married or common-law relationship

Almost **2 in 10** were in a couple relationship with someone living in a different home

5 in 10 had at least one child in their lifetime

72% felt that they could live in a common-law relationship



Men and women were about equally as likely to live alone

But women living alone were nearly twice as likely as men to be seniors
