

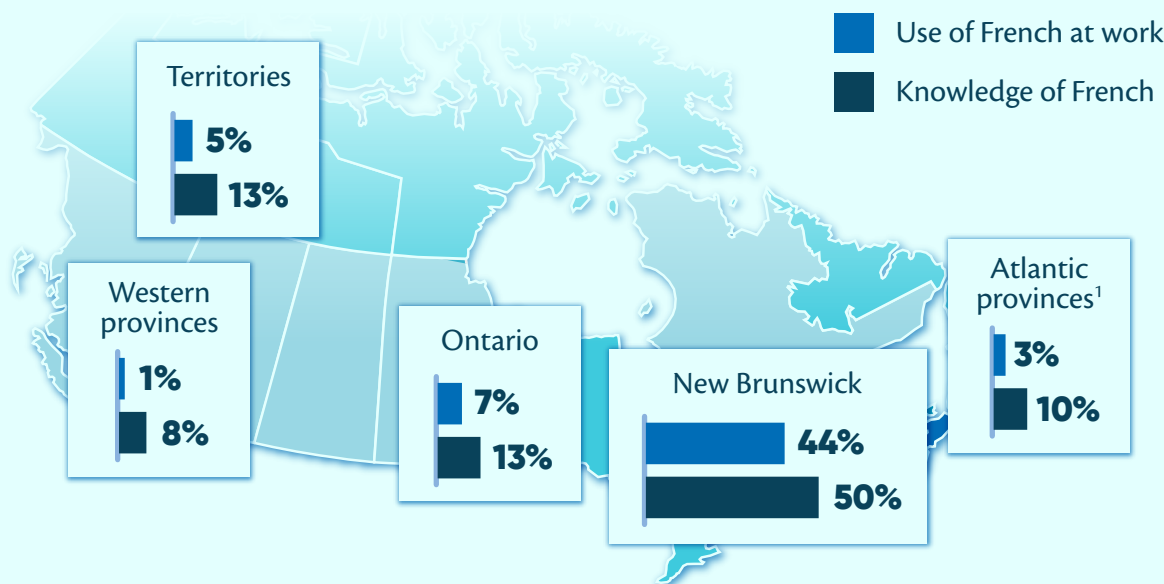
French among healthcare workers in Canada outside Quebec, 2001 to 2016

The number of healthcare workers who could speak French has increased, but their proportion has decreased, totalling **11.5%** of healthcare workers in 2016.

In 2016, **5.2%** of healthcare workers used French at work, a proportion that has been stable since 2001.



Use and knowledge of French by healthcare workers in 2016

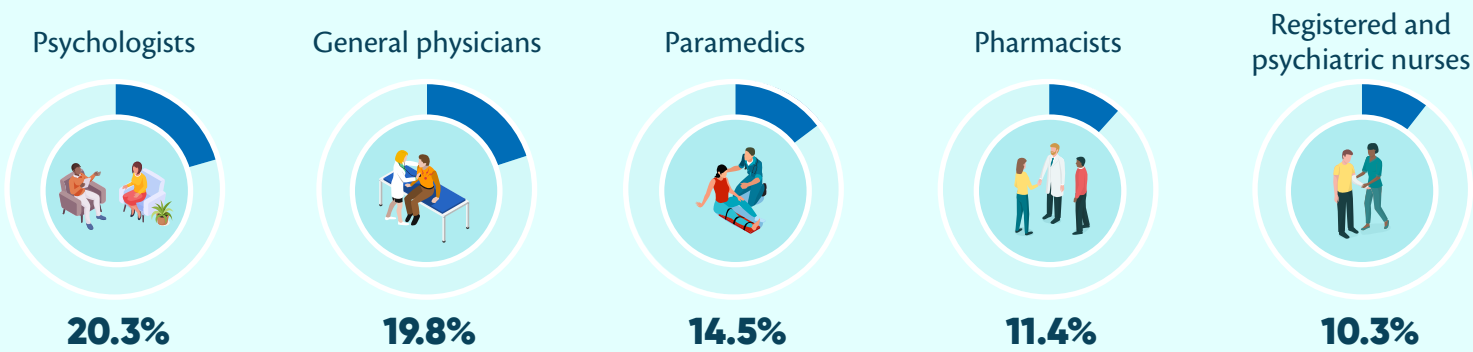
