
Before and after school care in Canada, 2022

## Proportion of children aged 4 to 12 in before or after school care



- 55% of children aged 4 to 5
- 48% of children aged 6 to 9
- 27% of children aged 10 to 12.

Most common types of before or after school care arrangements (among those using care)

- 1. Program in a school 45%
- **2.** Care by a relative other than a parent or sibling 25%
- **3.** Care by a sibling **11%**\*
- **4.** Program in a daycare centre **9%**

\*Correction notice: A weighting adjustment has been applied to the Survey on Before and After School Care in Canada (SBASCC). The weights for four- and five-year-old children have been updated to reflect the proportion of four- and five-year old children attending school. Previously, the weights of four- and five-year-old children represented those attending school, as well as some who were not eligible to attend school during the reference period of the survey and were therefore not in the target population.
