# 1. Objective of the Study

Treasury Board Secretariat engaged Statistics Canada to undertake a study of federal government employees in the bilingual regions of Québec on the use of both official languages in the workplace.

The main purpose of this special study was to collect information that can be used to assess whether federal employees have the opportunity to work in the official language of their choice when they are communicating with their department's headquarters and with the headquarters of central agencies. A second objective was to collect comments and suggestions to improve the use of the two official languages in the workplace.

Data were collected between November 1999 and January, 2000. The study sample was selected by Treasury Board Secretariat and reviewed by Statistics Canada. It consisted of a census of 787 Anglophones and a sample of 1346 Francophones.

# 2. Methodology

The study population consists of both Anglophone and Francophone federal employees in the bilingual regions of Québec. A census of the Anglophone population was undertaken. The questionnaire was addressed to Anglophones for whom the address was available; this represents 787 out of a total of 928 Anglophone employees working in bilingual regions of Québec. A sample of 1346 Francophone employees, out of a population of 11,520 Francophone employees, was selected from Treasury Board administrative records .

The mailing list of the 2133 selected employees was provided by Treasury Board Secretariat to Statistics Canada.

The initial mailing of questionnaires took place November 10, 1999. In order to follow-up on non-respondents, a second mailing package consisting of a letter and a questionnaire, was mailed to all individuals in the sample on Dec. 6, 1999. The accompanying letter instructed those who had not responded to complete and return the questionnaire. A third and final package was posted on January 28, 2000.

The characteristics under study may be different for Anglophone and Francophone employees. For this reason we tabulated Anglophone responses separate from the Francophone responses. Tabulations for Anglophone and Francophone, for each question of the study are presented as percentages, based on the total number of responses to the given question.

The results for Anglophone and Francophone cannot be directly combined, and care must be used in extrapolating to all Anglophone and Francophone employees, as explained in Section 5; Data Quality.

The results are reported by 'first official language'. The term 'Anglophone respondents' is used to describe those respondents who had 'English' as their first official language on the administrative records used by Treasury Board to select the sample. The term 'Francophone respondents' is used to describe those respondents who had 'French' as their first official language on Treasury Board's administrative records. These designations coincided closely with responses to Question 2: "My first official language is:"

Note that all tabulations contain the category 'Not Stated' meaning no answer was provided by the respondent to the relevant question. Also note that the 'n' column contains the number of responses for the pertinent question category. Some questions allowed only one response while other questions allowed multiple responses.

# 3. Structure of the Questionnaire

The questionnaire consists of 3 main sections:

# A) Employee Data and Functions

This section of the questionnaire, consisting of Questions 1 to 5, provides a linguistic profile of federal employees in the bilingual regions of Québec.

# B) Communications with Department's Headquarters.

This section determines frequency of communication between respondent and his/her department's headquarters.

Different means of communication are identified and the respondent provides information on his/her experience. Means of communication include:

- -telephone call from department's headquarters,
- -telephone call to department's headquarters,

- -e-mail from department's headquarters,
- -fax from department's headquarters,
- -drafts of documents from department's headquarters,
- -attending formal meetings at regional office with representatives of department's headquarters,
- -attending informal meetings at regional office with representatives of department's headquarters,
- -attending formal meetings at department's headquarters,
- -attending informal meetings at department's headquarters.

Whenever a respondent expresses some dissatisfaction, the respondent is invited to state why he is dissatisfied.

# C) Communications with Headquarters of Central Agencies

This section determines frequency of communications between respondent and the headquarters of central agencies. Five central agencies are identified: Treasury Board Secretariat, Public Service Commission, Statistics Canada, Public Works and Government Services and Justice Canada.

# 4. Language Profile of Respondents (Questions 2 to 6)

- The questionnaire was sent to 28 federal institutions situated in the bilingual regions in Québec, and employees from each of those institutions sent back responses.
- Of the 2133 employees who were sent the questionnaire, the response rate was 66%.
- Approximately three-quarters (73.8%) of the French-speaking respondents are in bilingual positions. The corresponding percentage is 91% for the English-speaking respondents.
- Of the Francophone respondents, 720 or 71.2% stated that they speak their second official language fluently or fairly well at work. The proportion is 95% or 387 for the Anglophone respondents.

# 5. Data Quality

The count of the number of useable questionnaires returned by institution is presented in Table 101 below (Question 1).

It should be noted that some envelopes were returned by Canada Post as *Return to Sender*. There are many reasons for this: moved, not on the department list, could not locate addressee or the addressee returned envelope with a *Return to Sender* indication. Some questionnaires were returned in the accompanied return envelope but the questionnaires were blank. It should also be noted there were no identifiers on the questionnaires, (for reasons of confidentiality) to allow us to mail to only those who had not responded. This allows for the possibility that someone may have responded more than once, although our letter accompanying the questionnaire asked those who had not responded to reply.

Non-response to the survey limits how the results may be used. The characteristics of the non-respondents may be different than the characteristics of the respondents. Thus care must be used in interpreting the results, (i.e., in extrapolating to the whole population) particularly for the Anglophone segment for which the rate of non-response was much higher. In particular, more caution should be used for smaller percentages. In general, the results of the survey can be used to identify issues and concerns.

As noted in Section 2; Methodology, the tabulations for Anglophones and Francophones have not been combined. To combine the tabulations, weights would have to be considered. For example, the population of Anglophones for the study was 787. Our selected sample was a census, therefore each sampled unit represented itself in the study. This is called a weight of 1. The population of Francophones for the study was 11,520. Our selected sample size was 1346, therefore each sampled person was to represent approximately 9 people in the total population – a weight of 9. These weights must be taken into account to combine counts of Anglophones and Francophones. However, to do so is not advisable because of the issue of non-response.

The number of respondents by language and the total population by language is given in the following table.

In viewing the data presented in this report, it is important to observe the number of respondents as well as the percentage of the respondents. In the first two sections of the report,

A) Employee Data and Function and B) Communications with Department's Headquarters, the number of respondents are relatively large. In the third section, C) Communications with Headquarters of Central Agencies the number of respondents are relatively small and thus the results are less reliable.

# 6. Communication With Department Headquarters Results from Questions 6 to 15

- The respondents were asked about their communications with their headquarters by such media as telephone calls, e-mail, fax, draft documents for comments, and participation in meetings.
- 23% of the Anglophone respondents (88 individuals out of a total of 387 Anglophone respondents) and 31% of the Francophone respondents (312 out of 1011) said that they frequently communicate with their headquarters. The rest do occasionally, rarely or never.
- 52% of the Anglophone respondents and 47% of the Francophone respondents said that they always or often use the official language of their choice when they receive telephone calls from headquarters. The other respondents indicate that they sometimes, rarely or never use the official language of their choice or found the question not applicable.

- The reasons why those who receive telephone calls from their headquarters do not communicate in the official language of their choice, are tabulated from a list of statements. "The other party cannot communicate in the official language of my choice" was applicable for 16% of the Anglophone responses and 31% of the Francophone responses. A majority of both Anglophone responses (57%) and Francophone responses (52%) indicate not using the official language of their choice for one of the following reasons: "I choose to use the official language of the other party", "I speak the official language of my choice while the other party uses the other official language", "my caller can speak the official language of my choice but is more comfortable in the other official language", "my caller suggests putting me in contact with a person who speaks the official language of my choice but I decide against it".
- When the English-speaking and French-speaking respondents initiate calls to the headquarters themselves, they use the official language of their choice more often than when it is the headquarters that initiates the call: 59% and 54%, respectively (compared to 52% and 47%).
- In the case of e-mail messages received from the headquarters: 59% of the Anglophone respondents said that they always or often receive e-mail messages in the official language of their choice, as did 69% of the Francophone respondents.
- The results for faxes and draft documents are somewhat similar to those for e-mail messages.
- In the case of formal meetings at the respondent's office, the proportions of Anglophones and Francophones who said that they always or often use their language of choice are 33% and 54%, respectively.

# 7. Communications with the Headquarters of the Central Agencies Results from Questions 16 to 25

- Five central agencies were identified in the questionnaire: Treasury Board Secretariat, Public Service Commission, Statistics Canada, Public Works and Government Services and Justice Canada.
- The questionnaire does not identify the subject of the communication.

- Only 34 individuals or 9% of the Anglophone respondents said that they communicate frequently with the headquarters of the central agencies. 137 individuals or 14% of the Francophone respondents said they communicate frequently with the central agencies.
- In the case of telephone calls received from central agencies, 30% to 38% of Anglophones said that they always or often used the official language of their choice when communicating with each of the central agencies. 45% to 63% of the Francophones said that they always or often used the official language of their choice. The study did not ask for reasons that could explain the results.
- In the case of e-mail messages, 51% to 67% of Anglophone respondents said always or often they received electronic mail messages in the official language of their choice. 67% to 81% of Francophone respondents said always or often.
- In the case of faxes, 42% to 46% of Anglophone respondents said always or often they received faxes in the official language of their choice. 70% to 81% of Francophone respondents said always or often.
- In the case of draft documents, 45% to 56% of Anglophone respondents and 67% to 77% of Francophone respondents said they always or often received drafts of documents in the official language of their choice.
- Across the 5 central agencies, 29% to 42% of Anglophone respondents attend formal meetings at their office with representatives of headquarters, always or often use their official language of choice. The comparable range of proportions for Francophone respondents is 49% to 67%.
- In formal meetings held at the central agency, 22% to 49% of Anglophone respondents always or often use their official language of choice. For Francophone respondents 24% to 60% always or often use their language of choice.

#### 8. Conclusion

This report presents a complete set of tabulations of the frequency of responses for each question.

The comments and suggestion collected by the survey are presently under study.

27.6% of respondents identified 'English' as their 'first official language', 72.0% identified 'French' as their 'first official language' while 0.4% did not indicate their 'first official language'.

# **Question 3 - Fluency in Second Official Language**

63.3% of Anglophone respondents and 33.2% of Francophone respondents consider themselves 'Fluent' in speaking their 'Second Official Language'. 95.1% of Anglophone respondents and 71.2% of Francophone respondents indicated they could speak their 'Second Official Language' 'Fluently' or 'Fairly Well'.

# **Question 4 - Language Designation of Position**

Table 204 below contains the distribution of responses relevant to the language designation of the respondent's position. 91.0% of Anglophone respondents and 73.8% of Francophone respondents stated they are in positions designated as *'Bilingual'*. 7.5% of Anglophone respondents and 24.5% of Francophone respondents are in non-bilingual positions (i.e. *'English Essential'*, *'French Essential'* or *'Either English or French'*).

# **Question 5 - Services Performed in Bilingual Positions**

According to respondents in bilingual positions, the most common reason for identification of a position as bilingual is to provide 'Service to the Public' – 52.5% of Anglophone respondents and 49.2% of Francophone respondents who indicated they are in a bilingual position gave this as their sole reason or one of their reasons. As well, 31.3% of Anglophone respondents and 33.6% of Francophone respondents indicated that their sole reason or one of their reasons for identification of a position as bilingual was 'Service to Other Federal Government Employees'.

# **Question 6 - Frequency of Communication With Department Headquarters**

As shown in Table 206, 22.7% of Anglophone respondents 'Frequently' communicated with their department's headquarters, 41.3% 'Occasionally' communicated while 25.8% 'Rarely' communicated. With respect to Francophone respondents, 30.9% 'Frequently' communicated with their department's headquarters, 29.0% 'Occasionally' communicated while 22.3% 'Rarely' communicated.

# **Question 7A - Receive Call From Department Headquarters**

As shown in Table 207A below, 27.9% of Anglophone respondents, when receiving a telephone call from department headquarters, 'Always' communicated in the official language of their choice, 23.8% 'Often' communicated in the official language of their choice while 15.8% 'Sometimes' communicated in the official language of their choice. With respect to Francophone respondents, 23.0% 'Always' communicated in the official language of their choice, 24.3% 'Often' communicated in the official language of their choice while 22.0% 'Sometimes' communicated in the official language of their choice.

# **Question 8A - Call Department Headquarters**

From Table 208A below, 33.9% of Anglophone respondents 'Always' communicated in the official language of their choice when calling headquarters, 25.6% 'Often' communicated in the official language of their choice while 14.2% 'Sometimes' communicated in the official language of their choice. With respect to Francophone respondents, 26.1% 'Always' communicated in the official language of their choice, 27.4% Often' communicated in the official language of their choice while 18.6% 'Sometimes' communicated in the official language of their choice.

From Table 209A below, 30.2% of Anglophone respondents 'Always' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice, 28.9% 'Often' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice while 14.7% 'Sometimes' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice. With respect to Francophone respondents, 37.2% 'Always' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice, 32.1% 'Often' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice while 13.1% 'Sometimes' received Electronic mail messages from headquarters in the official language of their choice.
